



FACT SHEET: POST-2011

WILL THE CASINO CONTINUE TO HIRE FIRST NATION PEOPLE?

- Yes, there is no change in this Agreement to current or future employment opportunities

WHAT HAPPENS TO THE LITIGATION?

- There is no impact on the 35% matter, which Chief and Council are currently considering their options on
- The Agreement sees resolution of the 20% claim and RST matter through both being dismissed on consent of the parties

DOES THIS MEAN ANY NEW DEVELOPMENT FOR CASINO RAMA?

- Yes, there will be some new development for which Rama First Nation has the first right to develop but any final Master Plan. OLG will pay for the development not Rama and OLG will pay a premium lease rate for all new lands it may require for future development
- Rama will be participating in the Master Plan for the Casino Rama development
- Rama retains the right as a First Nation to approve and permit all development on Rama lands (on and off reserve lands owned by the First Nation)

WHAT KIND OF DEVELOPMENT IS BEING CONSIDERED?

- OLG is looking at expanding Casino Rama to be a destination resort
- A new administration building and employee parking lot are being considered immediately
- A cultural centre is also being included in the Master Planning Initiative
- The Rotunda show will remain in place as it is

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR THE TRUST?

- The trust will continue to receive funds from the ground lease, CPI – for approximately \$4.5M per year
- The Trust will go forward with at least enough for annual December payments for the next 35 years
- The 3-year review process will continue on and the ability for a 3-year payout will be considered at the time – just like it is now
